Changes Coming to the US National Championship

The HACD and the event organizer, Old West Balloon Fest, have agreed to add an exciting new element to this year's event. The US and Canada will be running their country's National Championship simultaneously utilizing one consolidated staff. They will be scored as two separate events with an overall Champion awarded a newly designed International Champion's Cup.

A prize fund of \$20,000 is guaranteed plus a \$200 travel stipend to be paid in the form of a gas card bringing the prize fund to a total of \$30,000. Canadian pilots will only be eligible to receive the minimum guaranteed payout of \$150 and a \$200 gas card. The competitive event officially starts with on-site pilot



registration and the mandatory General Briefing on Sunday, August 9.

Other Enhancements Coming

In a major improvement for 2020, the organizer has secured the Hampton Inn and Conference Center as the host hotel for all pilots, crew and event staff. All pilot briefings and associated meetings will take place at the hotel's on-site conference center.

Several learning and skill development opportunities exist throughout the Championship including the following:

- Two full practice flights designed as learning experiences including post flight debriefings with an open forum led by event staff.
- Daily post-flight flight debriefings led by a top competitor. These session discuss an
 analysis of the tasks and the decisions made in the planning and execution phase of the
 flight.
- A BFA sanctioned safety seminar will be provided throughout the week built around 1 to 1½ hour sessions held at convenient times.
- Adam Magee, Assistant Safety Officer and organizer of the Balloon Training Academy, is developing an on-line training video to fully explain the FAA Waiver for the event. Competitors will have to pass an on-line quiz on Waiver details prior to arriving for the General Briefing.

Invitations and Application Deadline

Invitations are planned to be available by February 29 and completed applications must be received in the BFA Office on or before April 15, 2020.



Spirit of Annie Award

The "Spirit of Annie" award, established by the Northeast Ohio Balloon Pilots Association in memory of a very special observer, Annie Pryne, will be awarded whenever an observer, organizer, official or event volunteer most typifies the dedication, hard work and love of ballooning and ballooning people that set Annie apart.

CRITERIA

- To be awarded only when a nominee meets all qualifications, i.e. will not necessarily be awarded on an annual basis.
- To be awarded to an observer, organizer, official or event volunteer who best personifies the spirit of Annie Pryne and her belief in "being the best you can be."
- A nominee will have been an observer, organizer, official or event volunteer for no less than 5 years.
- A nominee will hold a creditable presence in the sport of ballooning, respected by observers, officials, organizers, pilots and crew.

- · A nominee will show willingness to share experience and knowledge.
- A nominee will have a positive attitude.
- A nominee will have a commitment to the sport and the improvement of all aspects of competitive ballooning and will be strong enough to speak out when needed.
- Most importantly, the nominee must have the ability to enjoy and interact with people.
